Treasurer's Report – Jonathan Davis

FINANCIAL REPORT FOR 2021

The club in 2021 had 374 members including coaches, managers, committee and players – 40% men and 60% female.

There were 293 players.

There were 210 players born after 1/1/2002 with 66% female and 33% male.

There were 91 players born after the 1/1/2009 with 66% female and 33% male.

This season we have managed to put new playing shirts on 210 players out of the 293 players in Carlton Redcliffs (72%) which was achieved via sponsorship and grants.

The club also managed to give some gifts to the coaches in appreciation of the work they do - \$6,350 compared to \$1,728 in 2020.

The club made a profit of \$7,357 for the season. My aim was to break even. We had \$4,000 of unexpected sponsorship (\$2,000 Team Cabling and Beck and Caul 2020 and 2021 sponsorship in 1 year). In addition, Just Hockey was okay about turning MVP into gift vouchers, so we reduced our coach's costs by \$2000.

The club has \$47,183 in the cheque account and \$25,314 in a term deposit. In addition, there is \$1,174 of merchandise on hand – Supporter T's and CPL men's Training T's.

Financially the club is in a strong position.

My concern is the number of members which has dropped from 306 in 2019 to 293 players in 2021 (4%). Not a big drop but the club is not growing. There is also a small number of males coming through the club at only 33%.

I would like to see the club calculate what expenses in the form of playing strips, video camera, goalie gear, balls etc are required in 2022. We can then see if we could fund a hockey development officer to help grow the number of junior members playing hockey for Carlton Redcliffs.

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Special Purpose Report

Carlton/Redcliffs Hockey Club Inc is an incorporated society, incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908. The financial statements of Carlton Redcliffs Hockey Club Inc have been prepared as a special purpose financial report authorised by the members.

This special purpose financial report has been prepared on the principles contained in the Income Tax Act 2007 to enable the members to meet their responsibilities outlined in the club constitution. Accordingly this report is not prepared in full compliance with generally accepted accounting practice (GAAP) and should not be relied upon for any other purposes or by anyone other than the restricted user group.

Measurement Base

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of financial performance and financial position on an historical cost basis are followed by the trust, with the exception of certain items for which specific accounting policies have been identified.

Specific Accounting Policies

The following is a summary of the specific accounting policies adopted by the trust in the preparation of this special purpose financial report.

Goods and Services Tax

These financial statements have been prepared inclusive of GST as Carlton/Redcliffs Hockey Club Inc is not registered for GST.

Taxation

The Club is exempt from income tax under section CB4(1)(b) of the Income Tax Act 1994.

Property, Plant & Equipment

Playing gear, equipment and uniforms have been valued at net realisable value. The board considers the net realisable value to be nil.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in previous years.

2. SECURITIES AND GUARANTEES OF LIABILITIES

There are no securities held over the club's assets.

3. **AUDIT**

The financial statements have not been audited.



Men's Club 2021 – Chris Goldsbury

2021 was a year where the men's club was able to build on the success of the previous year(s), and was certainly one of the more consistent years we have had in a while. Consistency was shown not only in performance, but in player retention and our coaching staff, which all contributed to successful showing, where we had four teams place in the top four, along with our Platinum Boys gaining valuable experience as a young team.

The Premier Men once again found themselves on the wrong end of a penalty shootout in the final, falling at the last hurdle once again. It was still a huge effort from the boys to get to the big dance for the second straight year, with the core of the side remaining and providing plenty to look forward to over the next years. The Platinum Boys may have struggled to register victories, but with a majority of boys Year 9 it was always a tough ask in a grade where teams with Year 10s (and above) were always going to be stronger. They came together well and made huge progress under the coaching of Lee Munt & Andrew van der Bent.

Our Mid-Week team continue to offer a more relaxed but competitive environment, and they came away fourth on the table. Big thanks to Greg Pierce who continues to organize the side which can't be all that easy. A number of our Mid Week team along with some of our more 'experienced' Div 1 players (along with others) fly the flag for the club in the summer in the Masters grade.

It was a great honour to introduce the Andrew van der Bent Trophy for the Most Promising Youth Male for the first time this year, with Ollie Munt the worthy winner.

A special mention of all our coaches who work tirelessly throughout the season. Keryn Ambler, Dean, Adam, Lee and Vandy – thank you for your efforts and your ability to connect as a men's club to create a strong identity across all the grades. A big thank you to all our managers also – Ritchie, Tanyia, Pip, Carolyn and Greg. We look forward to a 2022 season without any disruptions!!
